Stewardship Programs

- Regulated under
 - Litter Control Act (SARCAN)
 - Environmental Management Protection Act
- Importers or first sellers required to have End-of-Life program
- RS members represent government approved programs
- Voluntary programs



Benefits of Stewardship Programs

- Environmental Protection water, soil, wildlife
- Human Health
- Safety
- Resource Value
- Landfill space
- GHG reduction
- Security



Environmental Handling Fee

- Paid on program products
- May be visible or hidden
- Used to pay for end-of-life product management
- Non-refundable

Deposit

- Incentive
- Paid on program products
- Visible
- Refunded to consumer

- The recycling division of SARC
- Beverage containers
- 72 depots in 64 communities
- Collected 7 billion beverage containers





- **Glass** is used to create the reflective beads in highway paint
- **Plastic** can become carpeting, fiberfill in winter jackets and sleeping bags, or incorporated into new bottles
- **Tin cans** are used as a de-oxidant in the steel making process to become rail, rebar and pipe
- Aluminum cans are recycled back into aluminum cans for beverages.





- Used oil, antifreeze, diesel exhaust fluid, containers and oil filters
- 34 EcoCentres plus 150 municipal and retail locations
- Antifreeze, antifreeze containers, DEF containers added April 1, 2014
- Recycled over 307 M litres of used oil, 34 M oil filters, 5,300 tonnes of containers, 389,000 litres of antifreeze





- **Oil** refined into new oil
- Oil Filters resmelted for rebar, angle iron, pipe
- Antifreeze reprocessed in to new antifreeze
- **Containers** cleaned and pelletized as feedstock for new containers, posts, pipe, or patio furniture





- Old tires automobile, equipment, bicycle
- 3 Program Operations Return to Retail, Landfill Clean Up (complete) and Black Gold Rush (ongoing)
- 1375 retailer participants
- 27 Million tires recycled to date





- Recycled into
 - road paving
 - playground surfaces
 - paving blocks/stones
 - shingles
 - mats





- household paints, stains and varnishes
- Operated by Product Care Association under the ReGeneration
 brand
- 72 SARCAN Depots, return to retail
- Since inception has recycled over 2.6 million litres





- All Paint Give away
- Oil Paint Alternative fuel
- Latex Paint Recycled into new paint
- Metal Paint Can resmelted for rebar, angle iron, and pipe
- Plastic Paint Cans cleaned and pelletized as feedstock for new containers, posts, pipe, or patio furniture





- Televisions, computers, peripherals, monitors, printers, fax machines, audio/video systems and non-cellular phones
- SARCAN depots, collection events, Return to Retail (R2R), Crown Shred, Habitat for Humanity and large volume generators
- Computers for Schools approved for reuse
- Since 2007 has collected 25,000 tonnes of material





- Separated into components
 - Glass
 - Plastic
 - Metals steel, aluminum, copper
 - precious metals gold, silver, palladium
 - Used to manufacture new products





- Empty pesticide and fertilizer containers, obsolete pesticide & animal health medicine, grain bags
- 400 return to retail locations across Canada
- Over 1.7 M containers collected and in 2014-15 >185,000 kilograms of product
- Voluntary, industry-funded program
- New Ag Plastic (Grain Bag) program





• Material is recycled into drainage tile for farm use





- Household packaging and paper
- Agreements with 464 municipalities and First Nationsand 9 regional waste authorities (86.6% of households)
- Participating communities receive funding from the program to assist with their residential recycling program
- Material remanufactured into wide variety of products
